Location

Tuolumne Trails is built on 80 scenic acres of Sierra Nevada wilderness, seven miles east of Groveland, CA, near the grandeur of Yosemite National Park.



The camp is located off Highway 120 on Ferretti Road, and is surrounded on three sides by national forest. It is only three miles from the Pine Mountain Lake Airport, should emergency medical transport be required.

Camp Tuolumne Trails is dedicated to providing an enriching and fun camp experience in a facility especially designed and built for children with special medical needs.

Facilities and Activities

All facilities at Tuolumne Trails are wheelchair accessible. There are six bunkhouses plus two bath houses. The Great Hall is the heart of the camp. It houses the kitchen, dining room, infirmary, offices, arts and crafts center, and space for group activities. Outdoor facilities include an accessible swimming pool, large playing field, hiking and wheelchair trails, fishing pond and star-gazing site.



Campers

Campers come from California and Nevada in groups organized by local agencies such as Watch Resources, Muscular Dystrophy Association, Juvenile Diabetes, Cerebral Palsy family camps, and others. Reunions, school groups, church retreats, outdoor education programs are also welcome.
